

Everyday Safety


You have NEVER driven or been a passenger without wearing a seatbelt (since 2013 when it became law).




You know for a FACT that all of your headlights/tail lights are currently working.



You come to a complete stop when directed to.




Good Habits




Dash

You have not seen the low fuel light/signal in over 6 months.




Seasonal

Preventative Maintenance

Tires

You've checked your tire pressure in the last 30 days



Wipers

Your wipers don't bounce across the windshield



Oil

You check your oil in between oil changes

Wash

You get/do a car wash at least 5 times a year



Tires

You've checked your tire tread in the last year



Emergency Preparedness

First Aid

You have a first aid kit
in your car



Battery

You have jumper cables
in your car



Accidents

You have a seatbelt
cutter in your car



Emergency Preparedness

1st



You keep food/water/blankets/flashlights in your car in case you get stranded

2nd



You know how to change a tire OR you have roadside assistance coverage

3rd



You have OnStar or your emergency contacts listed in "Emergency SOS" (Apple) or "Emergency Mode" (Android)

Emergency Calls

Make an emergency call with no service or SIM card:

In a dire situation, you can still make emergency calls even if you don't have service or a working SIM card. As long as there is a network signal nearby, your phone will let you contact 9-1-1. The network doesn't even have to be your own carrier - it just needs a signal that is strong enough to put the call through. When you need to make an emergency call, dial 9-1-1 the way you normally would on your phone.



iPhone

Press and hold the side button and one of the volume buttons until the Emergency SOS slider appears. Drag the Emergency SOS slider to call emergency services. If you continue to hold down the side button and volume button, instead of dragging the slider, a countdown begins and an alert sounds.

Settings → Emergency SOS → Emergency Contacts

Android

Swipe up to get to the Lock screen, tap Emergency call. Enter the number. Your emergency contacts will appear at the top. A Medical info icon will appear at the bottom. Tap to show medical info you've added to your personal contacts.

Settings → System → About Phone → Emergency Information → Emergency Contacts
